

Child Trafficking Across Borders

Background

Child trafficking is child abuse. Children are recruited, moved or transported and then exploited, force to work or sold. Trafficked children experience multiple forms of abuse and neglect. This session aims to raise awareness of child trafficking, the risks it presents to children and young people and the role of the professional in identifying it.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, participants will:

- Be able to define child trafficking, what children are trafficked for and the key risk indicators
- Have clarity of responsibilities and procedures to follow
- Have awareness of agencies to utilise and work with
- Be able to identify high risk groups, current trends and models of good practice
- Have knowledge of relevant guidance, legislation and procedures, including the [Modern Slavery Act](#) and the [National Referral Mechanism](#).
